Dr. Rebecca Mount is a Clinical Psychologist with over 20 years of experience specialising in the assessment and intervention of children and families. She has extensive expertise working with children and young people who present with complex developmental trauma, attachment difficulties, and mental health challenges. Her work focuses on psychological assessments that inform intervention packages to support children and families, particularly within care systems.

Dr. Rebecca Mount is experienced in working with children in foster care, adoption settings, and residential homes, and she provides consultation to multidisciplinary teams in health, education, and social care. She offers comprehensive psychological assessments, including cognitive assessments and risk management plans, which help guide care decisions and support therapeutic interventions.

She has undergone specialist training in a wide range of therapeutic approaches, including Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR), and Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP). Her interventions are tailored to the individual needs of children, parents, and carers, and address a variety of presenting issues, such as anxiety, depression, attachment difficulties, PTSD, self-harm, and complex trauma.

#### **AREAS OF EXPERIENCE**

#### **Psychological assessment:**

- Children: initial screening and more detailed assessments to inform appropriate specialist CAMHS intervention. Risk assessments and risk management plans including the management of self-harm.
- Assessments of children to inform care planning by children's services (e.g. placement options, contact arrangements). General cognitive assessments.
- Adults: in-depth tailored psychological assessments which incorporate the impact of past experiences and traumas, consideration of presenting difficulties, strengths and needs and concerns for the future.
- The assessments move beyond mental health diagnoses to establish an in-depth understanding of the issues and concerns. This understanding is used to make recommendations for specific individualised psychological intervention plans. General cognitive assessments.
- Range of assessment tools including interviews, observations and for children play based assessments, Family Relations Test, Children's Self Report and Projective Inventory.
- · Range of psychometric measures including cognitive assessments (e.g. WPPSI-IV, WISC-IV, WAIS-IV),



behaviour and emotional questionnaires (e.g. Child Behaviour Checklist, Trauma Symptom Checklist, Assessment Checklist for Children) and measures of psychological distress (e.g. GAD-7, PHQ-9).

#### Psychological treatment / therapy:

- General psychological input across the lifespan to support to children, families and adults.
- Specialist input to adopted children, children in foster and residential care and their parents/ carers. To young adults presenting with a range of mental health needs residing in stepdown residential care. To parents with traumatic past experiences which impact on parenting processes and relationships.
- Range of presenting difficulties including depression, anxiety, self-harm, PTSD, complex trauma, attachment difficulties, personality disorders and wider difficulties associated with abuse, neglect and developmental trauma.
- Range of therapies including short-term solution focused family work, parenting advice and support,
  ACT, CBT, DBT skills, Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy, EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing) Compassion Focused and Acceptance and Commitment Therapy.

### Report writing experience:

#### Consultation:
